

News in Brief:

Lynn Walters, Treasurer of Wisdom Wave, known for her wonderful

food as owner of the Natural Cafe and author of Cooking at the Natural Cafe in Santa Fe, has now embarked upon an adventure in the Santa Fe Public Schools as project director of "Cooking with Kids, a school nutrition program. The program works with students, teachers and school staff to promote a more enlightened approach to good nutrition, by cooking international vegetarian foods in the classroom and then serving these foods in the cafeteria.

AVE evaluation yields positive results:

A research study by Patricia Brown in conjunction with the folk opera <u>AVE</u>, with data analyzed by the consulting firm of Mary Ann Shaening, yielded positive results for attitude change in three performances for youth. Five hundred questionnaires, returned after the secondary school performances, showed that the audience felt the play would help to increase awareness of the problems of sexual assault and child abuse, that the audience felt personally more interested in helping others with problems of abuse and that the play may help increase the community's efforts to help prevent these problems.

The folk opera was a multidimensional work addressing contemporary problems of abuse, women's issues, and metaphysical dilemmas. It grew out of inner psychospiritual work and professional work as a psychotherapist in Northern New Mexico where the universal dilemmas of unhealthy libidinal attachment and spiritual anguish have taken deep root. The metaphysical message of the play is that the untamed force of the feminine, creative energy represented by Mary Magdelene can only be harmonized by the genuine manifestation of spiritual love in the persons of the blessed Mother and her son Jesus. Put simply, nature will only bow to spirit, and nothing short of that. On the levels of inner depth psychology as well as social interrelationship, the divine feminine or the blessed mother, through compassion, friendship and sacrifice. provides the essential link in bringing this natural power into relationship with the Christ or Higher Consciousness. Mary is already one with the Christ energy, but Mary Magdelene has been split off from the Godhead through the abuse, expliotation and abandonment of the natural feminine by the human race. Mary's sacrifice demonstrated in the play is that of the feminine which puts the welfare of others above her own needs for attention or even affection from others. The emphasis here is upon the natural sacrifice that occurs in helping others and not upon suffering or penance as a release from "sin." Mary's autonomy from social convention allows her to reach out to another woman in true compassion, overcoming the usual competition women feel in encountering the wild power and beauty of the Goddess in another woman. Mary's sacrifice further occurs in the play in that she leads Magdelene to see Jesus, who as the manifestation of the highest male spiritual expression, completely takes hold of Magdelene's heart and she is utterly healed. The focus remains upon Jesus and not so much upon Mary, whose own crucifixion is internal and unseen but nevertheless potently real. Whether the play actually communicates

the depth of this message is unclear, but it seemed worthwhile to share this inner message with our Wisdom Wave friends. Again, *thanks to all* who made these performances possible. Production of musical theater is an enormous task, and it is not known at this time whether another production will manifest. © 1996, P. Brown
